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
OUR STORY

Outdoor Alliance is the only organization in the U.S. that unites the voices of outdoor enthusiasts to conserve public lands and ensure those lands are managed in a way that embraces the human-powered experience. We are a nonprofit coalition of national advocacy organizations that includes American Whitewater, American Canoe Association, Access Fund, International Mountain Bicycling Association, Winter Wildlands Alliance, the Mountaineers, the American Alpine Club, the Mazamas, the Colorado Mountain Club, and the Surfrider Foundation.

As backcountry skiers, hikers, paddlers, mountain bikers, boaters and climbers, we have a direct and intensely personal interest in the conservation of our public lands. We are often the first to notice when something is wrong in our outdoor landscapes, and we are highly motivated to protect these places and the experiences they offer.

LETTER FROM OUR CEO



While 2021 had many unexpected twists and turns, it was a good year for outdoor recreation and public land policy.

Back in January, we laid out ten goals we hoped to see the new administration and Congress accomplish for outdoor recreation, and we were able to see all of them make progress or completed. They ranged from building support for climate initiatives like 30x30, which will improve protected land and outdoor experiences across the country, to restoring key laws like the Clean Water Act and NEPA, which are wonky but hugely important for the future of protected outdoor spaces. We laid the groundwork for generational, transformative investments in the outdoors and climate in the coming year and built support for millions of acres of land protections.



Million Acres Protected— Bears Ears and Grand Staircase-Escalante Restored

The restoration of protections for important landscapes is a testament to the leadership and vision of the Tribes, and the support of many, including the outdoor community. Outdoor Alliance advocated for protecting Bears Ears and Grand Staircase-Escalante, worked to fight the rollbacks during the last administration, and then advocated for their restoration.

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National Forests

Forest Planning is a once-in-a-generation chance to protect outdoor experiences on National Forests around the country. Outdoor Alliance is advocating for conservation and recreation access on more than **18 million acres** of National Forest land.

Outdoor Alliance brought partners together to advocate for protecting outdoor recreation on **3.2 million acres** of **Montana's Custer Gallatin Forest.**

Million Acres, 1000+ River Miles— **Protecting America's Wilderness and Public Lands Act**

The outdoor community generated and advocated for a package of public land protections for 4 million acres and more than a thousand river miles across the West, including California, Colorado, Washington, and Arizona.

Cherished Recreation Destinations— Minnesota's Boundary Waters and Idaho's South Fork Salmon

Advocated for pausing or reversing egregious mining projects in the Boundary Waters and Idaho's South Fork Salmon, two cherished recreation destinations.

Policies on the Path to Restoration— Clean Water Act and NEPA

If you want clean water to boat or swim in, or care about development on public lands and getting a say over it, these two laws are where it's at. They were damaged in the last administration, and we've worked to restore them.

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Statements on Policy Issues

In coordination with the Joint Policy Shop, Outdoor Alliance submits statements to decision-makers on key policy issues, from land protections to equitable access to investments in the outdoors.

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First-of-its-Kind Recreation Package

A long-awaited recreation package was finally introduced in the Senate, with big ideas for streamlining permitting, adding more tools to the conservation toolbox, and helping agencies manage for human-powered recreation.


